

Winter Meetup Recap

We held our 2024 Winter Meetup on January 20 and it was a blast! 30 Honor Club members gathered together to reconnect and share 4-H news. Dr. Yoder visited us to bring updates from the state office. Dr. Yoder shared news of state office staffing changes, new committees being formed to discuss today's challenges in 4-H, changes in National 4-H, and some updated numbers for enrollment.

One talking point that stood out is that enrollment has almost risen back to pre-pandemic numbers. Prior to the pandemic, we had 263,000 youth benefitting from 4-H. In 2021, that number dropped substantially to 140,000. But in 2023, we saw those numbers rise back up to 223,000. Another important piece of news is that Jennifer Sirangelo has stepped down as National 4-H CEO and Jill Bramble has stepped up to fill the position.
