It is hard to believe we are 10 months into 2025 already! 4-H has been booming this year and Honor Club is no different. This spring we held our annual Honor Club Conference on May 30-June 1st. This year we enjoyed spending time with old friends, building new friendships, and reconnecting with those who hadn't attended Honor Club Conference in years. We voted on inductees for the 2025 year. We are excited to share that we had a significant increase from 34 attendees last year to 50 honor club members as well as 5 guests at the conference this year! We look forward to next year and hope to see the number continuing to grow. At conference we focused on several community service projects including cataloging historical 4-H artifacts, creating cards for 4-H camp staff and campers, and working to clean up the camp grounds. Throughout the weekend members had the opportunity to assist in helping revamp the 4-H Honor Club tapping video as well as to create some additional promotional videos.

4-H Congress 2025 was held in Raleigh North Carolina in July. At the 4-H Honor Club tapping ceremony we had the immense privilege to welcome 19 new members into North Carolina 4-H Honor Club as well as 2 honorary members. Honor Club members also helped throughout the week by leading workshops, participating in service projects, preparing the clover for the candle lighting ceremony, serving on Congress committees, and being an influential part in State Officer elections.

In September, Honor Club members participated in a weekend of service at Millstone 4-H Camp revitalizing the Ellis House; putting our Honor Club motto to action!

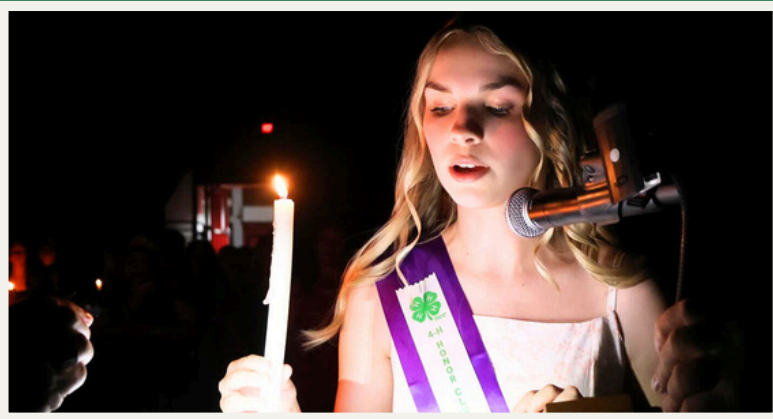

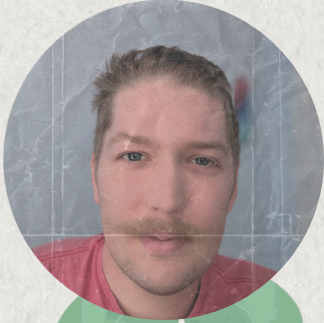

A NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT

So... what is Honor Club? Why do we have a North Carolina 4-H Honor Club? What is our purpose as Honor Club members?

From our beginning we have been tasked with and carried out our motto of Service. Dr. Jim Clark tells us in his 1984 book, *Clover All Over*, that in 1931 NC State 4-H Leader L.R. Harrill began organizing the NC 4-H Honor Club to develop leadership for Service to others. The concept of Honor Club developed from a need to plan and present "Short Course," now known as our beloved NC 4-H Congress.



That year, his associate, Elizabeth Cornelius, had just been diagnosed with tuberculosis and was unable to continue her work with NC 4-H. Of course, with the help of those first Honor Club members, the Short Course of 1931 was successful. Another notable first from the 1931 Short Course was the evening campfire and officer installation. This ceremony involved 4-Hers forming a colossal four-leaf clover with an 'H' in the center of each leaf, 4-Hers then passed the light from their candle to their neighbor, eventually lighting all of the candles for over 700 4-Hers. The 4-Hers sang 'Follow the Gleam' as they walked out of the stadium. Thus began our Candlelighting Ceremony on the last night of 4-H Congress.

For some of us, this ceremony and the tapping ceremony are recent memories. For others of us, much older memories. But for all of us, this was an important step in our 4-H career. We are able to 'give back' to an organization that helped form our character, taught us valuable lessons, and helped us create lifelong friendships.

So, how can we give back in this coming year? How can we live up to that motto of "Service"?

Here are some thoughts:

- Reach out to your local 4-H Agent and offer to help! Special projects, judging, teaching, chaperoning, fundraising, etc.
- Reach out to your family and friends who are NC 4-H Honor Club members - help them reconnect with 4-H and Honor Club!

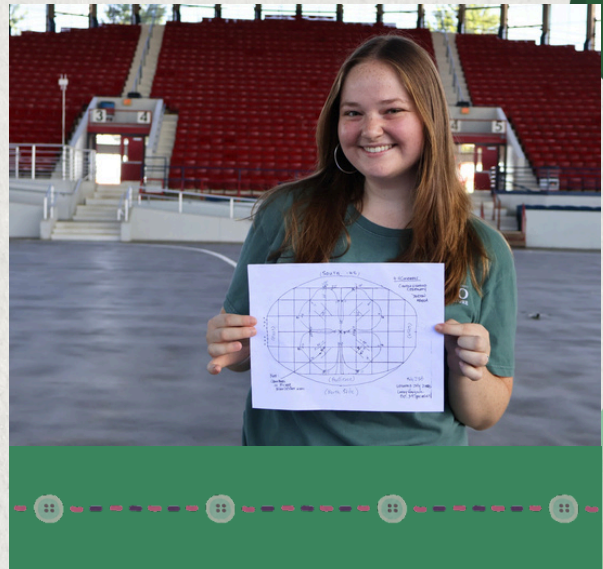

These members had two tasks – to paint the outside of the Ellis House and to work through artifacts donated to the NC 4-H History and Learning Center. Millstone 4-H Camp provided lodging and meals for the group. On Friday and Saturday, the group prepared the Ellis House by taping over windows, doors, and the brick foundation. Then the painting began. Members painted the fascia boards and other parts of the house with paintbrushes. When all of this was done, Joe Freeman used the camp's spray painter to paint the rest of the house. Several rotten boards were replaced. On Friday, Saturday, and Sunday, Adrian Gaskins, Honor Club members, and friends went through twenty boxes of donated artifacts and began cataloging them.

A THANK YOU FROM THE ELLIS HOUSE DONOR

Dear N.C. 4-H Honor Club Members,

Once again North Carolina 4-H'ers utilized their heads, hearts, and hands to contribute to the health of their community. This time it was to contribute to the health of an aging but stalwart farmhouse that houses the North Carolina 4-H History Museum. That farmhouse, also known as the Ellis house and the House that 4-H Peanuts Built, sits on Camp Millstone property, the vanguard of the North Carolina 4-H History and Learning Center complex.

On September 5th through September 7th, a dedicated and determined group of you came to Camp Millstone and spent three days, sunup to sundown, repairing some of the external wood siding of the farmhouse and repainting the farmhouse exterior. You repaired the siding in a manner to prevent future damage from inclement weather and repainted the farmhouse with loving care and a keen eye for detail. I was at Camp Millstone on September 19th, and I walked slowly around the museum, marveling at the Honor Club members' work.

A heartfelt thank you to all who participated in this endeavor. You gave generously of your time, your expertise, and your effort. On an annual basis approximately a thousand Richmond County schoolchildren tour this N.C. 4-H History Museum, learning not only about science, math, U.S. and N.C. history, but also about the opportunities afforded through the 4-H youth development program. 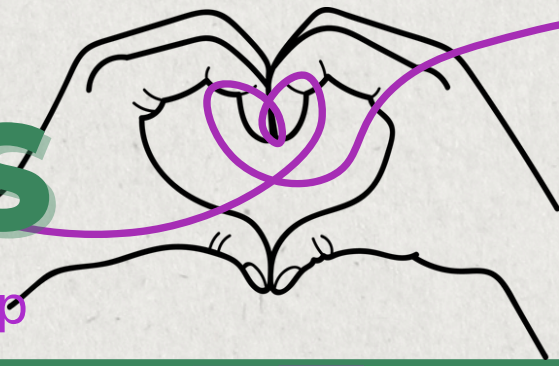

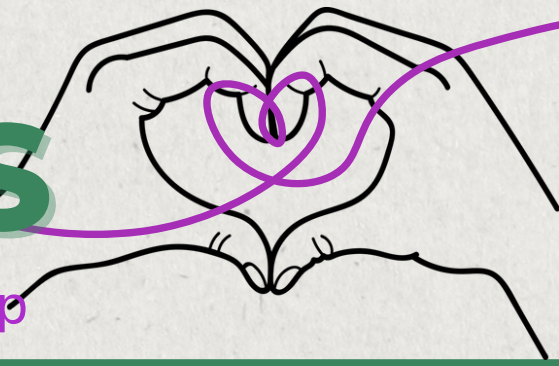

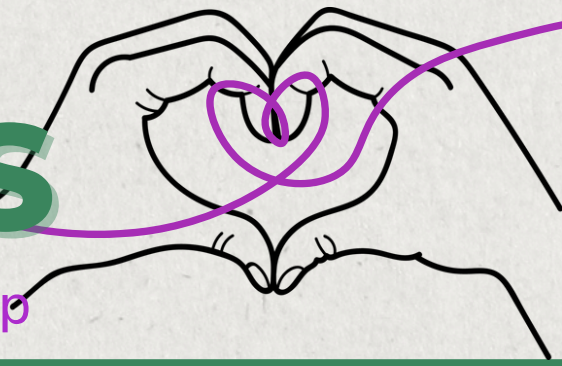
